CHOOSING AN EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICE

All Children's Services provide both care and education to children. In NSW, long day care, preschool, occasional care and family day care services are required to provide an early childhood education program as part of their service.

Receiving a high quality early childhood education has many long-term developmental benefits for children. All children are influenced by the quality of the early childhood education and care they receive.

Under the National Quality Framework, Children's Services are assessed and rated against seven quality areas:

- Educational program & practice Your child is supported to participate in play and learning.
- Children's health and safety Your child is protected from illness and hazards.
- Physical environment Your child plays in a safe, well maintained environment.
- Staffing arrangements There are enough qualified staff to give your child the attention they need.
- Relationships with children Your child is made to feel supported & welcomed.

- Collaborative partnerships with families and communities - Local community involvement and respect for the beliefs and values of families.
- Leadership and service management Your child is cared for in a positive and well managed environment.

CHILD CARE SUBSIDIES

In July 2018, the Federal Government introduced a new single means tested Child Care Subsidy to replace the previous Child Care Benefit and Child Care Rebate. This Child Care Subsidy is generally available to eligible families using long day care centres, occasional care, outside school hours care, and family day care services. Fees are paid directly to service providers to be passed on to families.

Family entitlement to the Subsidy is determined by combined family income, activity level of parents & type of child care services. To apply, go to your Centrelink account (linked to MyGov) and complete the Child Care Subsidy Assessment.

CHOOSING AN OUT OF SCHOOL HOURS CARE **SERVICE**

Out of School Hours Services (OOSH) provide play, care and recreation for primary school aged children outside of school hours. OOSH services provide children with opportunities to:

- Develop a strong sense of identity and wellbeing
- · Connect with and contribute to their world

- Become confident and involved learners
- Communicate effectively.

A quality OOSH service should achieve these outcomes in a safe, caring and fun environment where there are experienced staff, a happy atmosphere, child-centred programs, approachable management and effective policies and procedures.

The National Quality Framework applies to most OOSH services. Services are assessed. and rated against 7 quality areas such as the quality of programs, children's health and safety, the physical environment, staffing, relationships, partnerships and service management.

DISABILITY SUPPORTS FOR FAMILIES

NATIONAL DISABILITY INSURANCE SCHEME (NDIS)

The NDIS provides supports to people under the age of 65 who have a permanent and significant disability to participate in everyday life and achieve their goals. Reasonable and necessary supports can include a flexible range of services such as early intervention, personal care, mobility equipment, taking part in community activities, therapy services, home modifications or assistance with employment. Assistance from the NDIS is not means tested and does not impact on income support such as the disability support pension or carers allowance.

The National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA) is the independent Commonwealth government agency responsible for implementing the NDIS. Visit the NDIS website for more details.

ACCESSING THE NDIS

To access the NDIS ring **1800 800 110** and ask for an NDIS Access Request Form. Alternatively you can visit the Local Area Coordinators Office (Uniting) at Shop 3, 297 Great Western Highway,

Lawson or Level 1, 83 Henry St Penrith (ph: **4723 9444**). Submit the completed Access Form in person or by mailing it to GPO Box 700 Canberra ACT 2601 or email NAT@ndis.gov.au.

If approved, you will be assigned to a Uniting Local Area Coordinator. **Uniting** is the NDIS partner covering the Blue Mountains and Nepean. They will contact you and advise you of your approval and will organise a meeting with you to start preparing for your first plan. If you have been deemed as ineligible for NDIS you will be notified in writing.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EARLY INTERVENTION (ECEI)

To access NDIS for children under the age of 6, there is a separate pathway for early intervention called Early Childhood Early Intervention. This approach supports children aged 0-6 years with a developmental delay or disability and their families/carers and assists children develop the skills they need to take part in daily activities and achieve the best possible outcomes throughout their lives.

The NDIS has engaged partners to deliver ECEI and in the Nepean Blue Mountains this is **Lifestart**. As an Early Childhood Partner, Lifestart can help you to understand and access the most appropriate supports for your child. Lifestart will:

- Meet with you & get to know your child
- Work with you to determine the best supports for you and your child
- Identify and connect you and your child with the most appropriate supports in your area
- Provide some short-term early intervention where it has been identified as the most appropriate support

- Help you to request NDIS access if your child requires longer term early childhood intervention supports
- · If your child becomes an NDIS participant, work with you to develop an NDIS plan.

NDIS participants can also choose to use Plan Managers. Plan Managers assist you manage the financial tasks of the plan and enables individual access to non-registered NDIS providers. ABILITY LINKS


