TRAVEL TIPS

- ▶ Some experiences listed are seasonal and only available at certain times of year. To avoid disappointment, check opening hours before you travel and make bookings where necessary.
- Country roads can be in variable condition with windy or steep sections. Please slow down and drive to the conditions. Look out for wildlife on the roads at dawn and dusk.
- Using a GPS? Make sure you get the right directions by entering the name of the town not the area you want to visit (ie Katoomba NOT Blue Mountains).
- If you are planning to bushwalk, always put safety first. Download the National Parks and Wildlife Services app to check for updates on walking track conditions and bushfire danger levels.


