Alternatively, you could hold a garage sale or combine with friends and neighbours for a larger sale. Other useful places to pass on second-hand goods include www.freecycle.org (use the Blue Mountains group) and other social media websites.

Of course, many charities will accept second-hand items that are in **good working order**. Please contact the charity if you are unsure if your items are in need and be mindful that the charity may refuse your donation or simply be unable to accept it.
